Policy on Undergraduate Student Enrollment in ISE Distance Courses

Adopted by ISE Faculty: December 13, 2013

Policy

This policy describes the circumstances and limitations under which undergraduate students are allowed to take ISE courses using online education (distance, section 501).

An undergraduate student can take an ISE distance course while on a co-op or internship assignment. The student is limited to taking one ISE distance course per term, where a term is spring, summer 1, summer 2, or fall. If a student takes a 10-week summer course, they cannot simultaneously enroll in a summer 1 or summer 2 term course.

Prior to enrolling in the course, the student must obtain approval from their ISE academic advisor and the course instructor. The student must also obtain approval from their co-op/internship employer, per MSU career center policy. The approval form is included with this policy statement.

If an undergraduate student enrolls in the distance course, he or she is responsible for all arrangements necessary in the course, including technology requirements and proctor arrangements. Each student will also be responsible for paying all distance education fees associated with the course.

Not all ISE courses are offered via distance. Students are encouraged to talk to their ISE academic advisor about course offerings.
